



ExxonMobil Scholarship

History: The ExxonMobil Scholarship was established and awarded for the first time in 2001. ExxonMobil is a strong supporter of Thunderbird by providing internships and hiring Thunderbird graduates, as well as offering scholarships to our students.

Criteria:

- Applicants should have the legal right to work in the US, Nigeria, Indonesia, China, Malaysia, Russia, Chad, Thailand, Qatar, Equatorial guinea and Abu Dhabi and possess either work experience or academic background in finance or accounting (i.e. financial analyst, controller, internal auditor).
- Entering and continuing students must have a 3.5 GPA or better from their undergraduate school and at Thunderbird.

Process: Students submit a cover letter and resume along with a 500-word essay explaining why they are applying and their potential interest in working in the energy industry as well as their work experience/academic background in finance and/or accounting (financial analyst, controller, internal auditor). The Scholarship Office will obtain GPA information. The Scholarship Committee will review all applications and select the top applications to be forwarded to Irma Couto at ExxonMobil. ExxonMobil will rank the candidates within 10 business days of receiving applications, and the Scholarship Committee and ExxonMobil will select the recipient. The Committee will notify the recipient.
